Thank you for your request for information about Storm Overflows at Debden, which we received on 3 February 2026. Your request has been considered under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (EIR).

You requested:

1. How long was the storm overflow spill at Debden Road on 27 to 30 January 2026
2. EDM data for Debden Road, Quayside TPS, Martlesham TPS and Martlesham STW between October 2025 to January 2026
3. Why is there discrepancy between the various spills maps available

EIR Response: Provision of Requested Information

Item 1 is held by Anglian Water and has been provided below.

For the period 27th–30th, the situation is complex due to ongoing issues with the public spill map. Some activations are being received out of sync, which can prevent events from clearing on the map even though IRIS holds a correct end time. Our Digital, Data and Technology team are actively working on improving both reliability and data quality.

For AWS01527: The events on the 27 January 2026 were restricted to that day, we saw 2 activations between 10:50-12:52 and 14:07-15:33

Whilst for AWS1534, we received a number of activation throughout 27th , then no further activations until 30th.

Item 2 is held by Anglian Water and is reasonably accessible.

EDM data is available on our website. Monthly data is available a month in arrears [Monthly EDM Publication](#)

Item 3 is held by Anglian Water and has been provided below.

Anglian Water only provide data to 2 spills maps. These are the National Storm Overflow Hub (NSOH) [The National Storm Overflow Hub | Stream - Portal](#) and our own website [What we're doing to improve your local rivers & coastline](#)

As the data is published to the NSOH the data is available for the public to utilize and create their own maps. Anglian Water can not comment on the data surfaced on third party maps.

The maintenance status shown on the SAS website is caused when an outstation has issues with failed comms to a time drift.
